INITIATIVES

The next few questions are about some voter initiatives that will be on the November ballot. Each of these initiatives would repeal existing laws.

ROTATE Q7 – Q8 – Q9

7 Initiative 2117 would prohibit state agencies from imposing any type of carbon tax credit trading, including “cap and trade” or “cap and tax” programs, regardless of whether the resulting increased costs are imposed on fuel recipients or fuel suppliers. It would repeal sections of the 2021 Washington Climate Commitment Act, including repealing the “cap and invest” program to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by specific entities.

7.1 Supporters of the initiative say the state’s cap and trade program is responsible for a gas price increase of up to 50 cents per gallon and does nothing to reduce carbon emissions.

Opponents say the program has capped emissions from major pollution sources and raised over \$2 billion dollars in its first year for programs to fund climate change mitigation efforts and clean energy programs.
